

# How to contribute stories and photographs to the Road Trip Guides on the US Route 89 website



## Step 1. Log In

You have to log in to the US Route 89 website in order to add photos and stories to the Road Trip Guides.. To do this, click on the Share Your 89 Stories link in the navigation bar to go to the Login/Registration page.

In the User Log In form on the left side of the page, enter your User Name and Password and click Login. If you have forgotten your password, click on the Forgot Password? link.

## Step 2. Select the Road Trip Guide for your story

After logging in, you will be back on the Home page. Click on the 89 Road Trip Guides link in the navigation bar. In the Road Trip Guide menu on the left side of the page, click on the link for the section of US Route 89 where your story takes place.

**TIP:** Not sure which Road Trip Guide your photos and story belong on? Use the Search box at the top right of the page. Enter the name of the town, park, landmark or other term that relates to your story. Click on the search icon and you will be presented with a list of pages on the website listed in order of relevance. Pick the one that seems to fit and check the map or lists of places to make sure you've got the right page.



On the Road Trip Guide page, scroll to the bottom to the User Contributed Stories section and click on Add A New Story.



### Step 3: Enter Your Photos & Story

**Title:** Give your story and/or photos a title which will appear on the Road Trip Guide page.

**Description:** Enter a short description of your story and/or photos. This will also be displayed on the Road Trip Guide page.

**Images:** You may upload up to four photographs for each story. The photographs must be in jpg format. The program will automatically resize them to 400 pixels on the longest dimension. Click the Browse button to find the image on your computer. Click Upload Images to see the photos you have selected.

**Content:** Here is where you write your story or you can paste in text that you have written in a word processing program on your computer. Use the tools at the top of the text box to format your text and to add a link to your website.

**Copyright:** If you want to indicate your copyright, enter the information here. It should be in the following format: © Year YourName. Click on the checkbox to display the copyright with your story.

When you are satisfied with your story, click on Update on the lower left side of the page.

**TIP:** You can always go back to change or remove your stories. Find the story in the Road Trip Guides and click on Edit This Story to make your changes, or if you desire, you can delete the story.
